Cost for the Clinic

\$50 per 4-H enrolled youth outside of Pueblo County
\$35 per 4-H enrolled youth within Pueblo County
\$25 cattle fee if participating in any cattle work classes (one time fee)

Important Information

Youth are expected to ride with 4-H legal tack for each clinic & discipline
Each youth **must** ride in their 4-H Riding Level for all classes
Stalls are available - \$10 per night (bring shavings)
Camping/Living Quarters spots are available - \$45 per night, includes hookups
Dormitories are available (girls/boys are separate) Bring your own bedding (Free)
(Parents are welcome to stay in the appropriate dorms as well)
All stalls **MUST** be cleaned before you leave the fairgrounds
No dogs off leash on the Fairgrounds
