The 2024 Weld County 4-H Scholarship Packet is Available!

Did you know that the Weld County 4-H Program offers over 20 scholarships to graduating 4-H members? You could be eligible to receive one of them, or more! Applicants must be presently enrolled & active in a Weld County 4-H Club (Exception: college students applying for the Norgren, Ben Wilson, Aurora Organic Dairy, Leaders Council or Youth Executive Council Scholarships) & must have completed at least three (3) years of project work immediately prior to current year of enrollment. All you have to do is fill out one application to be considered for most scholarships (some require additional application information). You can find the application in the Bulletin Board at www.weld4h.org. *The application is an online form only and must be submitted by 11:59 pm on March 1, 2024*.

Two \$1500 Paul and Jean Hoshiko Family 4-H Scholarships -

Sponsored by the Weld County 4-H Foundation. These scholarships will be awarded to outstanding 4-H members based on demonstrated 4-H leadership, community service and 4-H accomplishments.

\$1500 Beef Excellence Committee Scholarship – Sponsored by the Weld County 4-H Foundation. Members must have completed at least four years of Market or Breeding Beef project work and exhibited a Market Beef or Breeding Beef animal at the Weld County Junior Fair or the Colorado State Fair at least one time during the last four years. Special supplemental page must be completed and submitted with scholarship application.

Five \$1000 Weld County 4-H Foundation Scholarships -Sponsored by the Weld County 4-H Foundation. Member may be enrolled in any 4-H project.

\$1300 Norgren Family 4-H Scholarship for College Students -Sponsored by the Norgren family through the Weld County 4-H Foundation. Must have completed one year of college working towards a degree in agriculture. Preference will be given to upper classmen. Must have at least 4 years of project work in the Weld County 4-H program.

\$1000 Ben Wilson Memorial Scholarship for College

Students - Sponsored by the Weld County 4-H Foundation through a donation in the memory of Ben Wilson. Must have completed one year of college. Must have a minimum of 4 years of project work in the Weld County 4-H program. Must be enrolled in a college program leading to a degree in an agricultural discipline.

\$1000 Dorothy Martin Zabka Memorial Scholarship for High School Senior or a College Student - Sponsored by the Weld County 4-H Foundation through a donation in the memory of Dorothy Martin Zabka. Eligible college students must be enrolled in a college program leading to a degree in an agricultural discipline. Must have at least 4 years of project work in the Weld County 4-H program.

\$800 Helmut and Bob Brunner Memorial 4-H Scholarship -Sponsored by the Weld County 4-H Foundation. This scholarship will be awarded to a member enrolled in an agricultural project and who will be attending Colorado State University.

One \$500 - Tim Seltzer Scholarship - Sponsored by the Seltzer Family. At least one \$500 scholarship will be awarded to an acceptable applicant in a given calendar year. Applicants must meet the certain criteria.

\$500 Weld County 4-H Shooting Sports Scholarships - Sponsored by the Weld County Shooting Sports Council. Members must be enrolled in the Weld County Shooting Sports program. One additional scholarship, as funds are available, in any amount up to \$500 for qualifying graduating senior or college student who is actively participating and/or volunteering. Special supplemental page must be completed and submitted with scholarship application.

Five \$500 Aurora Organic Dairy High School & Five \$500 Aurora Organic Dairy College Scholarships - Sponsored by Aurora Organic Dairy. Member may be enrolled in any 4-H project. Leaders Council Scholarships one \$525 for college and one \$525 for high school student. – Sponsored by the Weld County 4-H Leaders Council. Member may be enrolled in any 4-H project. Minimum of 1 year leadership responsibility in any organization.

<u>Up to Four \$500 – Weld County 4-H Horse Scholarships</u> -Sponsored by the Weld County 4-H Horse Council. Eligible applicants must have completed three years of 4-H horse project work. Applicant must be an incoming freshman or be actively enrolled in an accredited institution.

\$500 Weld County 4-H Dairy Scholarship and \$500 Alvie Rothe 4-H Dairy Scholarship - Sponsored by the Weld County 4-H Dairy Advisory Council. Members must be enrolled in the Weld County 4-H Dairy project. Must have completed at least three years of dairy project work immediately prior to current year enrollment. Special supplemental page must be completed and submitted with scholarship application.

\$500 Weld County 4-H Youth Executive Council Scholarships -Sponsored by Weld County 4-H Executive Council. Members may be enrolled in any 4-H project. Demonstrated leadership in 4-H activities beyond the local club level will be a major determining factor in selecting recipients.

Two \$500 Weld County 4-H Youth Executive Council Leadership Award - For high school or college students. Sponsored by the Weld County 4-H Youth Executive Council. Must have served and been active on the Weld County Youth Executive Council for three years. Special supplemental page must be completed and submitted with scholarship application.

\$500 Greeley Kennel Club 4-H Scholarship - Sponsored by the Greeley Kennel Club. The member must have completed two years of dog obedience in 4-H to be eligible. This scholarship would be renewable for the recipient's second year at college if established criteria are met. Special supplemental page must be completed and submitted with scholarship application.

\$500 Gene Inloes Memorial 4-H Livestock Judging Scholarship - Sponsored by the Weld County 4-H Foundation. Members must have participated in the Weld County 4-H Livestock Judging program for three years. Special supplemental page must be completed and submitted with scholarship application.

\$250 Kenneth & Clarice Benson Memorial 4-H Scholarship -Sponsored by the Weld County 4-H Foundation. Member may be enrolled in any 4-H project.

\$100 Josh Jarman Memorial 4-H Scholarship - Sponsored by the Josh Jarman Memorial Fund in memory of Jarman, a former 4-H member. The recipient should show exemplary leadership in 4-H community service. This scholarship may be awarded to an applicant who is receiving another county 4-H scholarship. Member may be enrolled in any 4-H project.

2024 Scholarship Application Procedure

- All application materials will be submitted using the electronic universal application form.
- No letters of reference, transcripts or signature pages are required. Students will supply the names of three people we may contact for references. Needed transcripts will be requested directly from the High Schools.
- All applications will be evaluated for the Holthaus, Murdoch's and Smith scholarships.

Helpful Hints:

- Fill out and submit only one electronic 4-H scholarship application form.
- Review the requirements for the CADA, Kimberling, Portouw and Sandstead scholarships. If you meet the requirements, highlight the boxes on the electronic application form.

The Northern Colorado Meat Goat Breeders Inc. (NCMGB), also formerly known as the Weld County Meat Goat Breeders, will be awarding one or more \$500 scholarships, depending on availability of funds. - At some point in your 4-H or FFA career, prior to November 14, 2021, you purchased a market or breeding goat from a NCMGB member, and received a copy of our organization's "Market Goat Application" form, bill of sale, or proof of transfer, signifying your purchase from a member of our organization. You are also eligible if you raised the animal yourselves as a NCMGB member.
- Have not previously received a scholarship from our organization.

4-H General/natural & Family Consumer Science E-Record Tips for Record Books

Watch for tips in every newsletter!

The **NEW** e-records are available to you in two ways: online, or on paper. Updated e-record books are available at the State 4-H website: <u>http://co4h.colostate.edu/program-areas/projects/e-records</u>-<u>general/</u>. Supplements are within the project e-record for those that require supplements. You may elect to receive all records for your projects from the Extension office or via your club leader at the appropriate costs. You will need to fill out an e-record for each project.

Getting Started

Start Now

Your record book is just that, a record of this year's work with a particular project. Fill out as much of the record as you can, as soon as you can. <u>DO NOT WAIT TO DO YOUR RECORD BOOK AT THE</u> <u>LAST_MINUTE.</u>

COVER (page 1)

This is the easiest page in the record book! There is no reason why this page should not be completed when you receive or download your record.

- Fill in what project you are taking, unit number or title and how many years you have taken the project including the current year.
- Check your age group. Remember that your age is as of December 31, 2023.

Juniors 8-10 Intermediates 11-13 Seniors 14-18

- Fill in your name, 4-H club, county, birthdate and age as of December 31, 2023.
- Make sure you get all signatures required (Member, Leader, Parent/Guardian and the date) at the completion of your project.

Make sure you get all signatures required at the completion of your project, prior to the fair. An approved, enrolled Weld County 4-H leader who is aware of your work on the project and in your club may sign your record book. Typically that is your club leader but he/she may designate a project leader to sign books.

HOW I PARTICIPATE IN 4-H (page 2)

Look at the "<u>Categories of Participation</u>" and fill in the "<u>Total this</u> <u>Year</u>" and the "<u>Description</u>" of your activities.

In the first section, write down the 4-H Projects that you completed, 4-H Workshops/Skill Activities/Contests in this project, Leadership Development in this project, Junior or Teen Leader.

In the next section, write down your Citizenship/Community Service & your Demonstrations/Presentations/Speeches that you participated in. Each one of those require a date, hours, activity & location.

Deadline for application is April 5, 2024.


Cake Decorating Workshop

There will be a cake decorating workshop on Sunday, February 25th from 1:00-3:00 pm in the 4-H Building and Sunday, April 7th from 1:00-3:00 pm in the 4-H Building, 527 N. 15th Avenue, Greeley at Island Grove Park. Come join us for this fun learning experience.


Members in Unit 1 will need to bring a baked 8", 9" or 10" round or square cake. The cake can have a crumb coat on it. You will need to bring frosting for your cake and edible items to decorate with, a cake spatula, and a tall cup for hot water. You will learn how to bake a level cake, frost and smooth the frosting on your cake, and use edible items to decorate your cake.

Members in Unit 2 will need to bring a baked 8", 9" or 10" round or square cake. Members in Unit 3 will need to bring a two layered baked 8", 9" or 10" round or square cake. Unit 4 will need to bring a character cake. Unit 5 will need to bring 4-12 cupcakes or cookies. Unit 6 will need to bring a baked cake to cut up and a knife. Units 2-10 may bring a frosted cake. You will need to bring frosting and all of your tips needed for the unit. You will learn how to use different tips specific for your unit.



Horse/Livestock/Small Animal E-Record Book Tips

4-H Livestock/Horse/Small Animal Record Books

All livestock and horse record books have changed this year! **Do not** use last year's format or you will lose many points or be disqualified when your record book is judged.

Doing record books is probably not on most members top ten list of "things I like most about 4-H". However, record keeping is an integral part of the educational phases of 4-H and an important life skill that will benefit members in many ways during their lifetime. Among other things, good record keeping skills will help 4-Hers learn how to:

- Set goals
- Collect and organize information
- Accept and complete responsibility and
- Make decisions

In this and future issues of the *Weld County 4-H Newsletter*, tips for completing the 4-H Livestock & Horse record book will be presented that will hopefully increase understanding of the record book and make it easier for members to fill out.

In this issue, you'll learn about where to get your record book and an important resource, the *Colorado Record Users Guide for Livestock/Horse e-Record.* Pages of the record book that should be completed at the start of your project year (*right now!*) will also be addressed. In this issue, we'll review the Feed Expense and Non-Feed Expense pages of the Livestock/Horse record book.

Getting started: where to get your record book

The e-record is available to you in three ways: online or on paper. Whatever method you use to obtain your record book, it is acceptable to do them by hand (write) or on your computer (type).

Updated 3-record books are available to be downloaded from the State 4-H website at <u>www.colorado4h.org</u>. Click on the "Access the 4-H Members Area", then click on "Project & Record Books" and then on "Livestock 4-H Project" links to get to the site where you can download:

- The appropriate record book for Junior (ages 8-10), Intermediate (11-13), and Senior (14 years and older) members
- The Livestock and Horse E-Record User's Guide (Soon to be available)
- Individual record book pages, if needed and
- Breeding supplements (for those with breeding projects)

Keep multiple livestock projects in one record book! Several sections in the record book have columns for separate projects. This is intended to distinguish species (i.e. market swine, breeding beef, etc.) and should not be used for individual animals of the same species.

Since we have a separate horse record book it cannot be used with other livestock, so a separate livestock record book will need to be completed.

Parts of the record book you can do now!

Start now! Several parts of the record book can be done even if you do not have your project animal! Be sure to read the headings of each record book sections, they will help you complete the record book. Remember, these are new record books this year and some sections have changed.

<u>COVER</u>

This is the easiest page in the record book! Check the box next to the project(s) you are taking (what species and if it is a market or breeding project) and indicate how many years you have taken that project, including the current year. Fill in your name, 4-H club, county, birth date and age as of December 31, 2023.

The **Project Agreement** should be completed and signed at the start of the project year. It is stating that you are agreeing to be responsible for the management of your animal and for keeping good records. Your parents signature indicates that they are willing to help give guidance and instruction when needed. <u>Make certain you sign the Project Agreement now before you begin your project.</u>

GOALS

Your goals should be "life skill" oriented. In other words, what skills do you feel are important that can be learned or improved on from taking this project this year? This could include things like decision making, record keeping, how to use a computer, money management and many others. Do not write one or two words, use a complete sentence. Record book talks about smart goals, refer to the Record Book guide for assistance if needed.

Junior members need to just answer the questions; Intermediate members need one goal; and Senior members need two goals.

Horse/Livestock/Small Animals

4-H Livestock/Horse/Small Animal Record Books Continued

INVENTORY

The inventory section has been divided into two sections; Animal Inventory and Equipment Inventory

ANIMAL INVENTORY

As your project begins, record the animals that you have at the START of your project. Be certain to write the animal value down in the second column and <u>again</u> in the project column that you entered. Then you need to record the animals that you have at the END of your project. Junior record book does not have the project columns.

Remember, for first year members, the project START is the first day you enroll in 4-H. For returning members, the project START is the first day of the 4-H year, October 1. The END is September 30.

EQUIPMENT INVENTORY

For Intermediates and Seniors there are two parts to your inventory; Beginning and Ending. For Juniors there is only an inventory of items they have acquired during the project. This section is for items such as equipment, tools, trailers, and facilities used for your project. The Beginning Inventory should be completed at the start of the project year. For members re-enrolling in 4-H, your project year started on October 1, 2023. For new members, your project year starts the day you enroll in 4-H. The beginning inventory is a record of any items (related to your project) or animals that you have on hand the first day of your project year and their value. (Other items or animals that you purchase during the project year will be listed on your expense pages.) For example, if you already have one brush, two halters, and one feed pan at the start of the year, you could list those items as follows:

Item	<u>Quantity</u>	Value
Brush	1	\$ 8.00
Halters	2	\$25.00
Feed Pan	1	\$10.00

Be sure to list the date your project year started. Also, make sure you total the value of your Beginning Inventory. In the above example, the total value would be \$43.00. You only need one inventory page, even if you have multiple projects; it is not project specific.

Special note for catch-it contest participants: be sure to list records for your catch-it project in their own separate column, even if you have other animals in that project. So, for example, if you have a catch-it pig and additional pigs for the market swine project, label one column "catch-it pig" and another column "market swine" and keep records separately.

4-H Livestock, Small Animal, Horse & Dog Manuals

Each household will receive one manual to be shared by siblings for the projects they are enrolled in. If a family wishes to purchase additional manuals they are welcome to do so at the Extension Office. The manuals are for all livestock, small animals, horse & dog projects.

Premises ID

A premises identification number (PIN) or location identifier (LID) is a unique code that is permanently assigned to a single physical location. PIN or LID registration is administered by each State and allows animal health officials to quickly and precisely identify where animals are located in the event of an animal health or food safety emergency. A PIN or LID is required to purchase official animal identification tags.

If you move, the Premises ID stays with the property you are moving from and you will need to get a new Premises ID for your new home.

You can obtain a Premises ID at <u>https://www.aphis.usda.gov/aphis/</u> ourfocus/animalhealth/traceability/state-pin/.

4-H Animal Care and Housing Form

All 4-H members with animal projects will be required to have a completed, signed and approved Animal Care and Housing Form for Colorado 4-H Livestock Projects form on file at the Extension Office. This form will be provided in two ways:

- <u>1.</u> 4-H online for those that have their animals at their place of residence and on our 4-H Website <u>www.weld4h.org/projects/</u> for those that have their animals some place other than their residence. If your animal project is housed at your place of residence you can fill out this form while filling out your paperwork during the enrollment process online.
- 2. If your animal project is not housed at your place of residence then you will need to go to our 4-H Website, print the Animal Care and Housing form and fill out both sides of that form. This gives us additional information about your specific situation and helps with the approval process. Please give us detailed information or we will send them back for you to adjust your comments.

FFA Animal Care and Housing Form

All FFA members with animal projects are required to have a completed, signed and approved Animal Care and Housing Form for Colorado FFA Livestock Projects form on file at the Weld County Fair Office.

 FFA Members who want to show at the 2024 Weld County Fair must fill out and turn in an Animal Care and Housing Form by 5:00 p.m. on May 1, 2024 to the Weld County Extension Office to be eligible to show at the 2024 Weld County Fair. These forms will not be accepted via email. You can download the FFA Animal Care and Housing Form at <u>http://weldcountyfair.com/entries_events/</u> fair_book_entry_forms.

Market Beef Identification Day

February 3, 2024 To be eligible for the 2024 Weld County Fair and Junior Livestock Sale; and Southeast Weld County Fair (if eligible) all market beef animals must be identified.

• Identifying will be done ONLY on Saturday, February 3, 2024 at the following location:

GREELEY PRODUCERS SALE YARD 711 "O" Street, Greeley 8:00 am to 11:00 am

- A scale will be available at Market Beef ID Day.
- Retinal scans will be collected on ALL market beef for the Weld County Fair, Southeast Weld County Fair and Colorado State Fair. Retinal image scans will be attached to the Colorado State Fair Nomination Forms before they are submitted to Colorado State Fair.
- A \$4.00 fee for retinal scans and ear tags will be collected at this time. Checks can be made payable to Weld County Fair.
- For Colorado State Fair you can family nominate. In order to family nominate, you must fill out the nomination form for each exhibitor and include all animals on each nomination form.

Calves will be brand inspected. You need to bring the following documentation with you:

- Valid proof of ownership
 - ⇒ In-state animal needs a brand certificate, including the home raised cattle
 - ⇒ If coming from Out-of-state, animal needs purchase invoice or brand inspection and health papers
- You are required to contact the Brand Office (970-352-8622) <u>prior the ID Day</u> to get your brand certificates. Brand Certificates will not be written at ID Day. All Brand Certificate fees will be paid by the exhibitor to the Brand Office.

There will be NO make-up date. All cattle need to be identified on February 3, 2024.

2024 Livestock Judging Informational Meeting

2024 Livestock Judging informational meetings will be held at 6:00 p.m. at the Bunkhouse.

- February 28th is the informational meeting for new members and Junior (8-13 years old) members
- March 6th is the informational meeting for Senior (14-18 years old) members

If you have kids in both age groups, you don't have to be at both, just the Senior meeting on March 6th.

Judging Opportunities for 4-H Members

Judging is a great opportunity for 4-H members to improve decision making, communication, problem solving, and time management skills in a fun, team-oriented setting. Members do not have to be involved in any specific project to take part in judging programs. Some potential benefits of judging include college scholarships, opportunity to travel, personal and team awards. Check out one or more of these judging opportunities!

Signing up for Judging Teams

Members who want to be on a judging team will need to sign up through 4-H Online in the Group Section once your account has been approved.

Horse Judging

Develop an eye for horses and understand what exactly goes on in the show ring. Workouts generally start in January or February. The State Horse Judging Contest is held in Fort Collins in conjunction with the State 4-H Conference in June. Horse Bowl

By participating in Horse Bowl, you can learn about the horse in a fun setting. The team competes in knowledge bowl contests that demonstrate understanding of equine science and management. Horse Hippology

Very similar to Horse Bowl is the Hippology program. It's a fun and competitive setting for youth enrolled in a horse project to demonstrate the breadth of their knowledge and understanding of equine science, and in particular the practical application of this knowledge and skill. A hippology contest consists of four phases: judging, written test, stations, and team problem. Top state teams have the opportunity to travel to national level contests. Livestock Judging

Workouts for Livestock Judging normally start in early March. Generally, the team will also compete in several county contests prior to the State contest in June, held in conjunction with the State 4-H Conference in Fort Collins. Youth Meat Quality Assurance (YMQA) Certification

4-H & FFA members with MARKET and/or BREEDING livestock projects are required to complete Youth Meat Quality Assurance (YMQA) Certification. If you have never taken this program and did not take the program for a second time last year after you turned 14, you must attend a certification. For the purposes of YMQA, livestock is defined as BREEDING AND MARKET BEEF, DAIRY, SHEEP, SWINE, GOATS, RABBITS AND

POULTRY. Horse projects are excluded from YMQA requirements.

Weld County members may complete certification in any county in the state. If attending in another county, please call their Extension Agent in advance to confirm your participation in their program and, find out specific time, location and directions to the training.

The Weld County MQA training will be held:

- March 26th from 4:00-7:00 pm in the 4-H Building, 527 N. 15th Avenue, Greeley
- March 27th from 4:00-7:00 pm in the 4-H Building, 527 N. 15th Avenue, Greeley

This training has several different stations that you will go through at your own pace. **Please be here no later than 6:00 pm to attend the training.**

If you are unable to attend the training in Weld County, it is your responsibility to attend a training in a different county. Please do not wait until the last minute to attend a training because choices become limited.

There will also be a virtual option in late spring or early summer that will only be valid for one year.

Weld County 4-H/FFA Dairy Heifer Replacement Project (DHRP)

The purpose of the program is to provide 4-H and FFA members an opportunity to:

- 1. Learn how to select a dairy heifer that has the potential to be a good producing cow.
- 2. Learn how to raise a good quality animal, demonstrating approved management principles.
- 3. Offer for sale a top quality dairy replacement animal at the conclusion of the program.
- 4. Give non-farm members the opportunity to gain valuable experience in the dairy industry.

The Weld County 4-H Dairy Advisory Council will oversee and assist in managing this project.

Eligibility

- 1. Any duly enrolled Weld County 4-H or FFA member is eligible for this program.
- 2. The member must enroll, or be enrolled, in a 4-H or FFA dairy cattle project.
- 3. The member must specifically enroll their project heifer in the DHRP by **March 15th** of the project year. Forms are available online only at <u>www.weld4h.org</u>, then click on "projects", then click on Dairy Cattle.

Requirements

- 1. Members may enroll up to three (3) heifers each year. All nominated heifers may be shown, but you are limited to showing one (1) heifer in the DHRP class and to selling that same one (1) heifer. Members must designate their DHRP heifer on their Fair entry.
- 2. Member must be the sole owner of the animal. A copy of the brand certificate must be submitted with enrollment. Two photos of the heifer, one of each side, must be included with the enrollment.
- 3. The animal must be:
 - a. Born September 1 November, 2022 (21-23 months old at Fair time).
 - b. From a registered sire (AI or natural breeding).
 - **C.** From a dam that is either registered or grade. Production records must accompany enrollment.
 - d. Positively identified by a 4-H Leader, FFA Advisor, Extension Agent, or member of the Council.
 - e. A minimum of 40 days pregnant as of March 1. A certificate of pregnancy from a licensed veterinarian or other qualified individual must be turned in with enrollment. <u>Heifers MUST be due to calve no earlier than</u> <u>September 1st and no later than November 30th.</u>
- 4. Any breed of dairy is acceptable. Heifers must be bred to a registered service sire (AI or natural).
- 5. Heifers must be exhibited at the Weld County Fair. All heifers enrolled in this project will show in a separate "Dairy Replacement Heifer" class.
- 6. Members are strongly encouraged to participate with their project heifer at the Colorado Dairy Youth Extravaganza, June 9-11, 2024 at Island Grove Park in Greeley.

Sale

- 1. Heifers will be sold at the Weld County Fair.
- 2. Heifers will be inspected and pregnancy checked at the Weld County Fair prior to the sale. Heifers will not be allowed to sell if:
 - a. They are not at least six (6) months pregnant,
 - b. They are not healthy or in good condition according to breed standards. Heifers are expected to meet the following height and weight measurements (measurements listed are for Holstein heifers; for other breeds contact the Weld County Extension Office):
 - i. 21 month old heifer 1086-1372 lbs; 52-56" at withers
 - ii. 22 month old heifer 1148-1420 lbs; 52-57" at withers
 - iii. 23 month old heifer 1148-1420 lbs; 53-57" at withers
- **3**. Members will receive all proceeds from the sale less a five percent (5%) commission, if they have turned in a completed record book after the Fair.
- 4. Members are encouraged to contact potential buyers for their animals. Buy back opportunities will be available for businesses that purchase animals.
